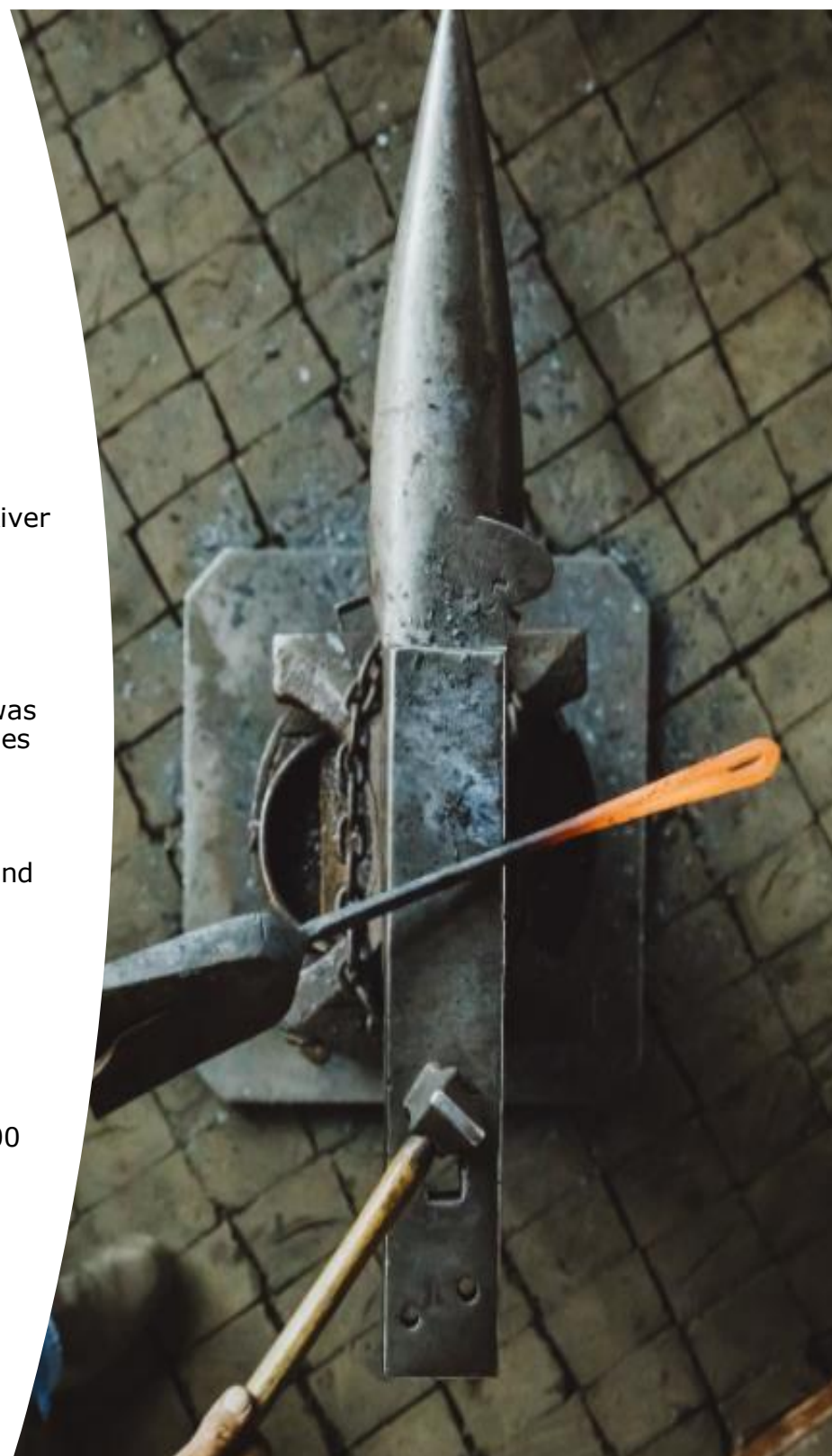

ITINERARY:

Saturday July 17, 2021 / Saturday September 04, 2021

CHECK IN: between 2:00 pm and 5:00 pm

DINNER: in the Remington building dining room with other guests at 6:30 pm

PRESENTATION: a short video and/or presentation in the Pine Loft at 8:00 pm

Sunday July 18, 2021 / Sunday September 05, 2021

BREAKFAST: in the Remington building dining room at 8:00 am

PACKED LUNCH: will be provided to take to the museum for your enjoyment – please bring your own water bottle

CHECK OUT AND DEPART: A maximum of 12 people can be safely guided through the museum. At the time of reservation, we will book you into the 9:30 am or 11:00 am check out and departure time. It is a 20-minute drive (see enclosed map) to the museum. Tours will commence at 10:00 am and 11:30 am

ARRIVE: at meeting place to meet your guide and commence your museum tour

LUNCH: there is a wonderful spot available by a little lake in the Carraig Ridge community close to the museum to have lunch and enjoy the view

RETURN: participants are expected to have departed the museum and property by 4:00pm

What to bring:

- Small Backpack for your lunch and water bottle
- Comfortable Walking Shoes or Hiking Shoes/Boots
- Raingear
- Sunscreen
- Camera and Binoculars (optional)

ADDITIONAL NOTES

BOOKING INFO

Note: A 25% deposit is required at the time your booking is confirmed, the remaining 75% deposit is charged seven days before the event. Both deposits are non-refundable. Deposits are 100% refundable if COVID restrictions are preventing us from hosting the event.

MAP

Take highway 40 to highway 1A. At the intersection turn west (right).

After bridge over Ghost Lake, continue 4.3 km further west.

Turn right on Jamieson Road (there is a sign and speed drops to 80 km/hr just before it).

Proceed north on Jamieson Road for 4.2 kms to Courville Road and turn right.

There is a Fire Hall on the corner.

In 200 m, take the first right into the driveway for **Wild Buffalo Ranching**.

Proceed till you pass a house on the right and come to a building with a large garage door.

Drive to the right of the building, then past another tin shop building and park in the large gravel lot in the back.
